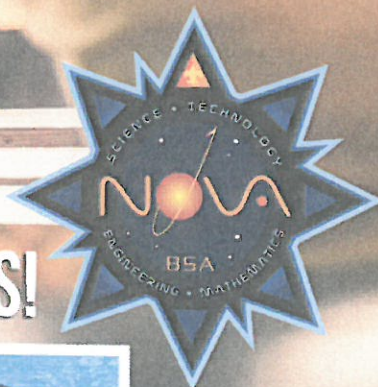

Calendar Reminder

- **Sign-Up Night**
 - Arrive one hour early and make sure station chiefs have their stations set up.
 - Act as a “greeter and floater” during sign-up night window.
 - Be available to answer questions.
 - Play traffic cop –direct families to next available station.
 - If back-up occurs, use your best judgment.
 - Coach station chiefs if they are keeping families at their stations too long – process is meant to be completed in 30 minutes or less.
- **Conclusion of Sign-Up Night**
 - Help Station 4 chief get Cubmaster signature on all applications.
 - Assist Station 4 chief in separating “Local Council Copy” from applications and record dollar amount for fees and form of payment on each application (check #, etc.).
 - Gather sign-up night materials and make sure room is clean
 - Contact district membership chair and district executive immediately following sign-up night to report your success and make arrangements for pickup/drop-off of applications and fees.

Huge achievements come in small numbers!

As you may know Seneca Valley School District doesn't allow fliers to be distributed to students in the classroom. However Pack 406, determined to recruit Scouts for the very first time since the School Board's decision 3 years ago, held a sign-up night and according to Cubmaster Brad Bell, *"It was a huge success!"* Pack 406 now has a minimum of 7 new Scouts with as much potential to recruit another 3-5 by the end of the month!

For Pack 720 their membership goal seemed unachievable – 21 new Scouts! However with a little positive reinforcement, great Volunteers and following the Rocket into Scouting playbook the Pack was able to recruit over half of the needed Scouts to reach their goal in one night! *"It was an extremely successful night, especially since our sign-up night was held on the same night as a popular event in town!"* said Katie Gallagher (Cubmasters Wife). But the success comes in the follow-up, 8 additional Scouts who signed the sign-in sheet didn't make the commitment to join at the sign-up night. With a little follow-up the Pack is now able to recruit 20 new Scouts and be well on their way to 5% growth for the year!

Pack 58 wanted their name to become part of household conversations, so they turned to Facebook marketing and with \$40 reached over 4,249 prospective families over a two week period within the zip codes they serve. To put that into perspective, there are only 611 young men in grades 1-5 in the Mars Area School District. So for a very minimal promotion cost, they reached 6.5 times more families than the flier alone. Coupled with strategic placement of the beascout.org yard signs, Pack 58 is set for success! Cubmaster Robert Seman commented, *"Most people no longer look at fliers, however they do look at Facebook."*

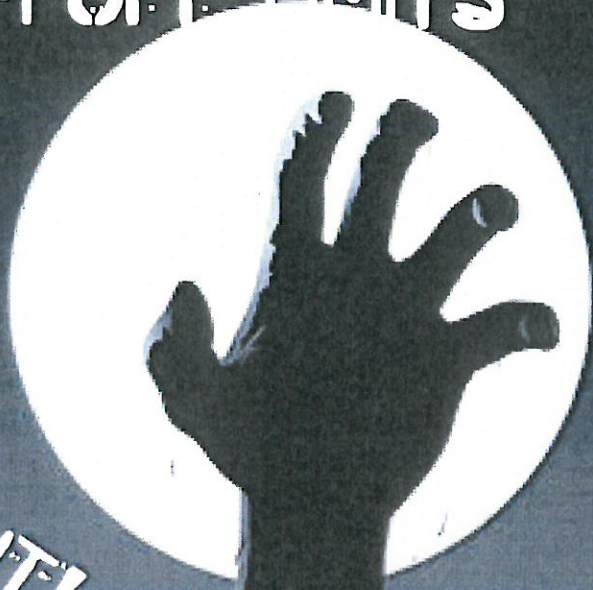

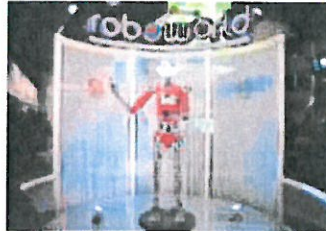

Scouts Attending Camp Stay in Scouting

The purpose of a Council organized and funded popcorn product sale is to ensure the Council has the funds to operate the year round camping properties to support unit camping operations as well as district activities, trainings, and summer camp programs. In addition, the Council pays for local unit accident and sickness insurance as well secondary liability coverage. The cost for this coverage has increased significantly in the past few years. In addition, the Council now helps units by tracking PA criminal background check compliance.

Studies show that Scouts who attend a BSA camping program stay in scouting up to five times longer than Scouts who do not. Camping equals retention in the program. Long-term retention equals character education and life-skills training.

Foursquare Credit Card Reader Program

In an age where fewer and fewer people are carrying cash, Trails End has helped tackle this program through a partnership with a smart phone credit card reader program. Within 2 weeks of applying, the local pack, troop, or crew can have a free card reader and account to process credit card transactions. Position Required Training Policy

Objective: To provide a quality Scouting program through volunteers who understand Scouting's resources, methods, policies, and requirements.

Effective date: June 1, 2014

Who the policy applies to: Adult volunteer leadership registered as members or seeking to register as members of the Boy Scouts of America within the Council who are deemed "direct contact leaders" and committee chairmen.

Definition of direct contact leader:

Cub Scout Program: Cubmaster, Assistant Cubmaster, and Den leaders (all cub programs).

Boy Scout Program: Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster

Venturing Program: Advisor and Assistant Advisor

Exploring Program: Advisor and Assistant Advisor

Policy Implementation Plan:

Cub Scout Program:

- ***All NEW direct contact leaders and committee chairman*** must complete online basic training for their position and youth protection prior to submitting their adult application, or attend a district training session and submit a copy of their training certificate issued at the training.
- The certificate of completion (online certificate or issued trained card) must accompany the adult application when submitted to Council.
- ***Current Cubmasters and Committee Chairman must complete the online training or attend a basic training session by November 30, 2014 and submit the training certificate with their charter unless they have already completed training and it is recorded with the Council.***
- ***All other direct contact leaders have until November 30, 2015 to comply with the required training policy.***

Position Required Training (cont.)

Boy Scout Program:

- **All New direct contact leaders and committee chairman** must take the online portion of the required basic training then must complete the Council Outdoor Training Weekend Course within 1 year of registering to remain registered with the BSA.
- **Outdoor Weekend Training Session Credit Waiver.** A leader may be allowed credit for the Outdoor Weekend if he is an Eagle Scout or for female members earned the Girl Scout Gold award, or if the new or current member has military experience and can produce a military ID or honorable discharge certificate.
- **New leaders must submit the online training certificate** when registering and the Outdoor Certificate at the rechartering period one year after registering.
- **Currently registered Boy Scout direct contact leaders and committee chairman have until November 30, 2015 to comply with the above position required training.**

Venturing and Exploring

- New direct contact leaders must complete the online training or attend a district training prior to submitting registration.
- Certificate of completion must be submitted with adult application as appropriate.
- **Currently registered direct contact leaders** have until November 30, 2015 to comply with the position required training.

Currently registered leaders must complete the position required training by November 30, 2015 to reregister with the Boy Scouts of America.

Council Support:

- The Council has scheduled multiple trainings in the next year to assist volunteers in completing the training.
- Volunteers may schedule a time to use a Council computer to take the online training during normal business hours and at Scout camp during available time periods.
- The unit may have a registered volunteer attend a "Train the Trainer" training session to become a trainer for the unit, then conduct the required training within the unit according to Council guidelines.

Boy Scout Leader Training is a one day (indoor) session plus (outdoor) course presented by the Moraine Trails Council Training staff. To be considered trained, Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters must attend both.

To: Unit Leaders

Re: PA Criminal background Check Law revision proposed House Bill 1276

Dear leader,

Due to the overwhelming volunteer response to PA Act 153, the state legislature is introducing House Bill 1276 which may modify several of the requirements of the original legislation that was signed into law at the beginning of this year.

Several months ago we asked our unit leaders to get ahead of the Act 153 and help us implement the new law with a target date of July 1, 2015 to turn-in required paperwork.

In light of the introduction of the new bill we are postponing the deadline of July 1st for submission of the criminal background checks to the Council. The Council leadership is asking for your patience in waiting to see if house bill 1276 passes and what changes may come from the new law. We will e-mail and mail a new Council compliance plan to you by September or sooner if the bill is adopted before that date. If the bill is not adopted, the new deadline for current volunteers is December 1, 2015 which is the unit recharter deadline.

Please understand that we do not believe that the bill will simply be revoked. If you have done the background checks you may hold onto them until December 1, 2015 or you may submit them to our office as per the original instructions. Also understand that new leader applications will still need to be in compliance with Act 153 until we are told otherwise by the state. What we are waiting to be communicated from the new bill is further description of compliance and any changes to compliance.

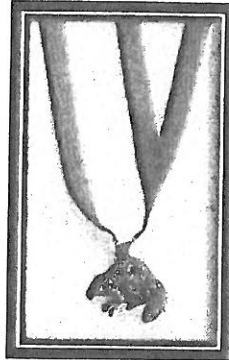
I appreciate your understanding as we are "put on hold" for the next couple months. Once we know the outcome of the new bill we will communicate with you immediately.

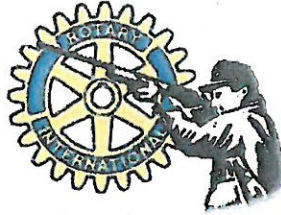

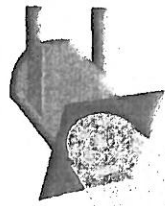
