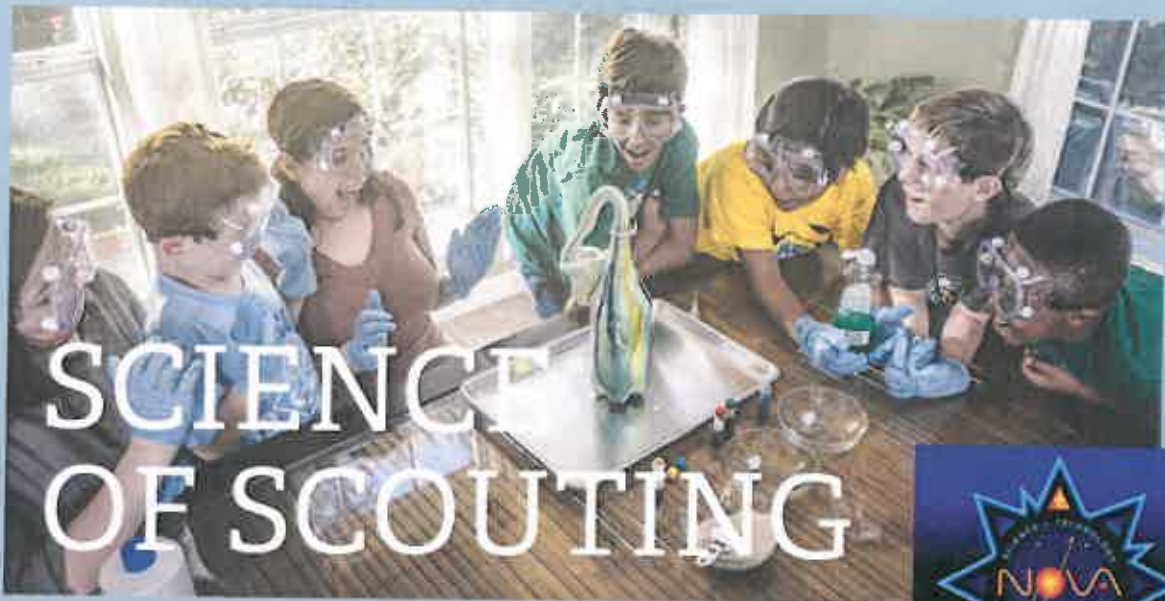
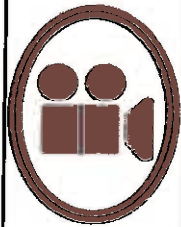
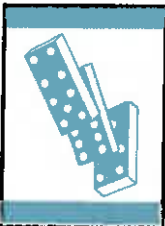

RE: Annual Order of the Arrow (OA) Unit Elections

DATE: January 4, 2016

Dear Unit Leadership,

As you may know, 2015 was the 100th Anniversary of the Order of the Arrow. At the National Order of the Arrow Conference Kuskitannee Lodge won, for the fourth time, National Drum Champions! This made us the winningest lodge for this competition. In addition, you may have seen our new anniversary patch sets, history books, and new dining hall table and sign.

Before we discuss elections, we want to remind all of our members that **dues (\$10.00/year) are payable now at the Council Service Center for 2016**. Please encourage your members to stay current with their dues, as we have seen a significant decline in paid members. If membership keeps declining, we will need to significantly raise dues to stay operable.

Enclosed you will find information on the annual elections period for the Order of the Arrow. A form is provided for you to return to either schedule or decline a unit election for 2016. You will also find a brief list of events. Please pay special attention to Conclave June 10-12 at Camp Bucoco. This year, we are hosting the annual gathering of lodges in our section and we will need "all hands on deck" to support the event, which would be a great opportunity for inactive members to get involved.

At any time, should you have any questions, comments or concerns, please contact Kuskitannee Lodge's new Lodge Adviser, Daniel T. Brown, at d_t_brown@hotmail.com. Some issues may need to be addressed by the Lodge Executive Committee as the ruling body, but he can hear and share concerns to continue to make 168 GREAT!

ELECTIONS:

What is the Order of the Arrow (OA)?: The Order of the Arrow is Scouting's National Honor Society. It recognizes those who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives and, through that recognition, cause others to conduct themselves in such a way that warrants similar recognition, to promote camping, to develop leaders, and to crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others. Each Boy Scout troop or Varsity Scout team with qualified Scouts is urged to hold an election not later than April 1, 2016, to select candidates for a Call Out to be held at Summer Camp in 2016.

Youth Membership Qualifications:

1. A Boy Scout or Varsity Scout who holds the First Class rank, is under the age of 21, and is registered as an active member of the troop or team may, with the approval of his unit leader, be nominated for election. Prior to the annual election, the unit leader must certify the nominee's Scout spirit and youth membership qualifications.
2. After registration with a troop or team, the youth must have experienced 15 days and nights of Boy Scout camping during the two-year period prior to the election. The 15 days and nights must include one, but no more than one, long-term camp consisting of six consecutive days and five nights of resident camping, approved and under the auspices and standards of the Boy Scouts of America. The balance of the camping nights must be overnight, weekend, or other short-term camps.

Voting for youth candidates will be based on their spirit of brotherhood, cheerfulness (no matter how tiresome their duties) and a willingness to give unselfish and wholehearted service to others at all times.

Adult Membership Qualifications:

Each year, upon holding a troop or team election for youth candidates that results in at least one youth candidate being elected, the unit committee may nominate registered unit adults, 21 years of age or older, to the lodge adult selection committee. The number of adults nominated can be no more than one-third of the number of youth candidates elected, rounded up where the number of youth candidates is not a multiple of three. Recommendations of the adult selection committee, with the approval of the Scout executive, will be candidates for induction, provided the following conditions are fulfilled:

1. Selection of the adult is based on the ability to perform the necessary functions to help the Order fulfill its purpose and is not for recognition of service, including current and prior achievements and positions.
2. The individual will be an asset to the Order because of demonstrated abilities that fulfill the purpose of the Order.
3. The camping requirements set forth for youth members are fulfilled.
4. The adult leader's membership will provide a positive example for the growth and development of the youth members of the lodge.

A return form is enclosed for you to use in notifying the Lodge of a request for an election. The election should be held at a regularly scheduled unit meeting or camping experience. Every effort should be made to have 100 percent attendance of both youths and adults at this meeting. In preparation for the election, you could: ask current OA members to talk about their Lodge experiences, talk about Kuskitane Lodge, discuss the elections process, talk about cheerful service, etc. An election team from the Order of the Arrow must be on hand to conduct the election. Please return the form with your choice of election date no later than February 1, 2016. Feel free to contact us if you have any questions. Call outs will be held at Camp Bucoco this summer. Those elected have the opportunity to gain membership by taking their "Ordeal" August 19-20 or May 12-14, both at Camp Bucoco. More information on the ordeal will be provided to the elected candidates.

In summary:

1. Return the form by Feb. 1, if you would like an election, or wish to decline.
2. You will be contacted by a Lodge member to finalize the election.
3. At the election, 50% of the active youth (under 21) must be present to vote.
4. After the election is held, should you have at least 1 troop member elected, you may nominate an adult for membership.
5. At the election, the team members will ask for address, contact info and birthday of each youth selected.
6. The call out will be held at Camp Bucoco each Wednesday night following campfire. If your unit is going out of council for summer camp and having your members called out there, please contact the Lodge adviser for proper documentation to take with you.
7. The call out is simply a public recognition, and is not a required step for the person to take their ordeal. The call out experience is highly recommended as part of the process and mystique of the experience.

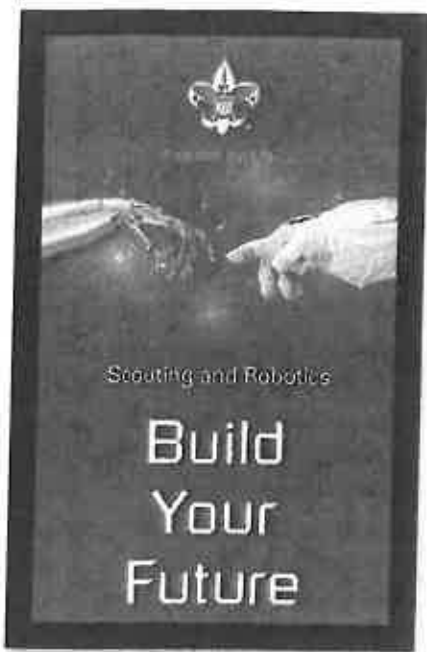

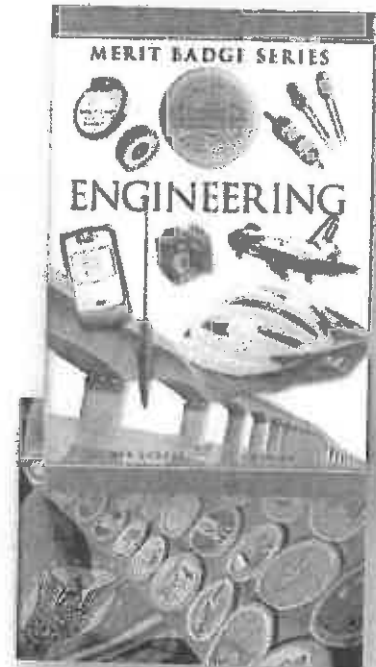
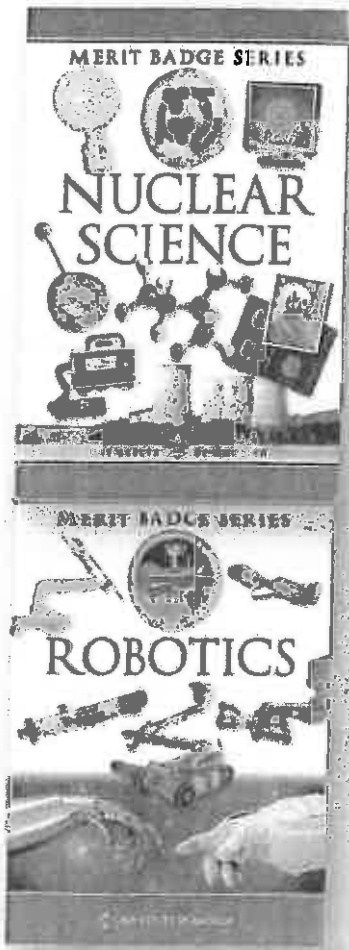

2017 National Scout Jamboree Moraine Trails Council Information Sheet

Dates: July 19, 2017 through July 28, 2017

Travel Plans: The Moraine Trails Council Jamboree contingent will leave Camp Bucoco, located at 150 Bucoco Lane Slippery Rock, PA 16037 at 8:00 AM, July 19, 2017. The contingent will arrive at the Summit the same day, at approx. 1:00 PM and camp there through the morning of July 28, 2017, when we will return to Camp Bucoco by approx. 4:00 PM.

Organization: The Jamboree is on a first come, first serve basis to all who qualify. After our Troop and Crew has been filled, a stand-by list of alternates will be established. Scouts will be assigned to a Jamboree Troop consisting of 36 Scouts and 4 Adult Leaders, our Venturing Crew will consist of 8-9 Venturers and 1-2 Adult Leaders.
